

Cleaning and disinfecting the exterior surface of your Accu-Chek Inform II meter is, at a minimum, daily recommended for dedicated patient devices.\*

#### Acceptable cleaning and disinfection products include:

- **Clorox**<sup>®</sup> **Germicidal Wipes** (Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) registration number (Reg. No.) 67619-12 Premoistened disinfecting cloths (active ingredient 1% (or less) solution of sodium hypochlorite in water)

#### **Cleaning meter process**



Prior to cleaning, place meter on level surface. Power off meter.

Using approved wipe, clean by gently wiping:

- a. Outside of meter
- b. Carefully around test strip port



Dry meter thoroughly after cleaning.



After cleaning or disinfecting be sure the meter is dry and remember to replace the meter in the base unit to charge.

### **Disinfecting meter process**



Prior to cleaning, place meter on level surface. Power off meter.

Using approved wipe, disinfect by gently wiping:





Allow meter surface to remain damp for entire contact time with recommended disinfection solution for:

a. 1-minute contact time with Clorox Germicidal Wipes b. 2-minutes contact time with Super Sani-Cloth Germicidal Disposable Wipes

Dry meter thoroughly after disinfecting.

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**Avoid getting liquid into test strip port!** Failure to follow these instructions may damage the meter.

**D0** squeeze excess cleaning solution from pre-moistened wipe or blot on paper towel to remove excess cleaning solution.

**DO NOT** clean or disinfect the meter while performing a blood glucose or control test.

DO NOT get any moisture in the test strip port.

**DO NOT** spray anything onto the meter.

**DO NOT** immerse the meter in liquid.
