HIV places an enormous burden on individuals, families, and communities.

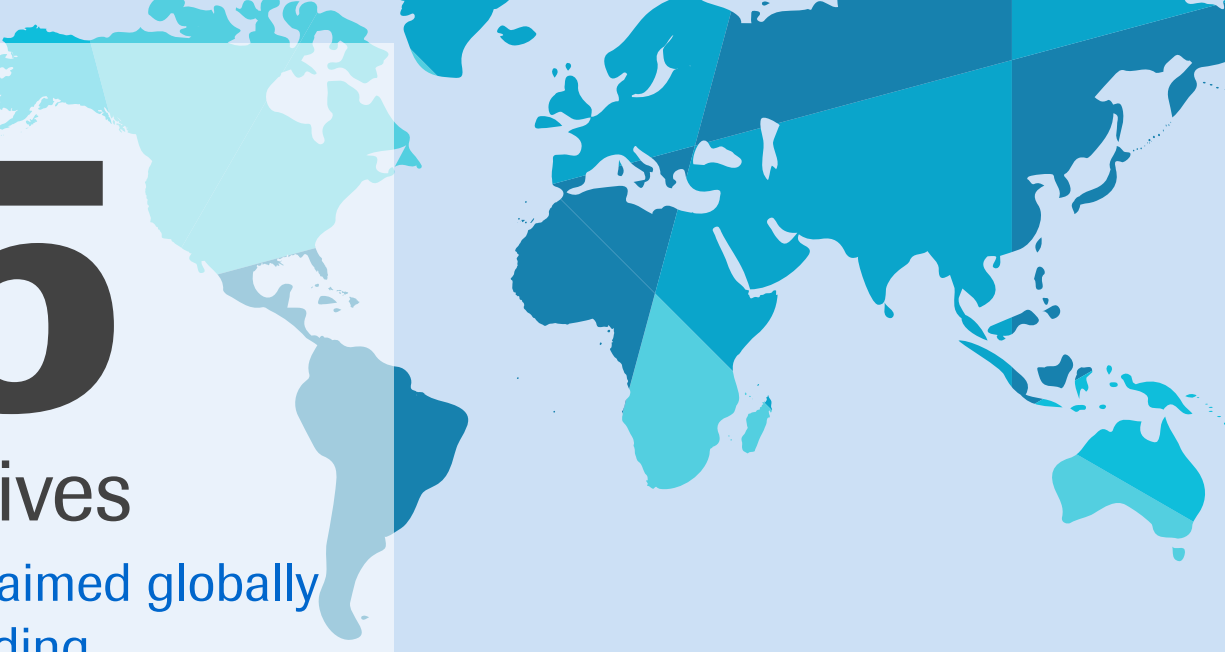

PREVALENCE

HIV remains a serious global health issue, with **certain populations at especially high risk**²

- Sex workers
- Men who have sex with men
- People who inject drugs

1.1 million in 2015.³



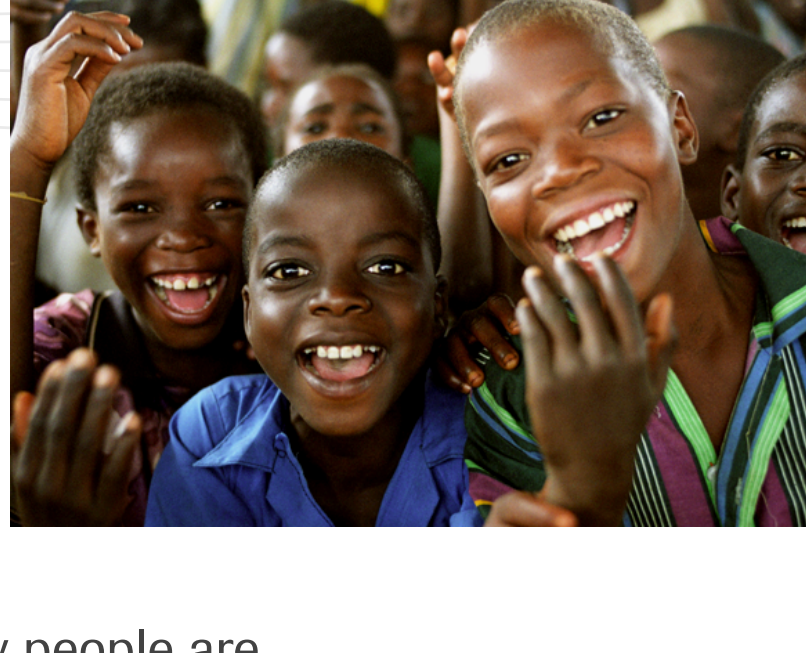
Only **54%**

- **Delivery**
- **Breastfeeding**

By 2020, 90% of all people with HIV will know their status, 90% of those who know their status will receive antiretroviral therapy (ART) and 90% receiving ART will have viral suppression.

PROGRESS

40-fold increase in access to ART since 2002.⁴

17 million people living with HIV had access to ART therapy by the end of 2015.³
