What you need to know about Trichomonas vaginalis

Overview

Trichomoniasis is a sexually transmitted infection caused by the parasite *Trichomonas* vaginalis



It is the most common curable STI worldwide






There are an estimated 143 million new cases a year



Infections can be very dangerous for pregnant mothers & their children

Signs/Symptoms

The infection is asymptomatic in **70% of** individuals. However consult a doctor if you experience any of the following:



In women:

- Genital irritation
- Pain with urination or sexual intercourse
- Malodorous ("fishy smelling"), yellow-frothy discharge



In men:

- Discharge from the penis
- Irritation inside the penis
- Burning with urination or after ejaculation


Prevention

Correct and consistent use of latex condoms (be aware, the parasite can infect areas that are not covered by a condom.)

> Open communication with sexual partners

Sexual partners should be treated *simultaneously* to reduce spread

Global Impact



Incidence (and 95% UI) of chlamydia, gonorrhoea, trichomoniasis, and syphilis in women and men aged 15-49 years by WHO region, based on 2012 data.

Risk Factors







A previous episode of trichomoniasis



A history of other sexually transmitted infections



Having sex without a condom

Key Notes

Trichomonas vaginalis is the most prevalent non-viral sexually transmitted disease worldwide





Unfortunately, trichomonas is excluded from most STI screening programs

About 1 in 5 people get infected again within 3 months after receiving treatment therefore management of contacts is critical to reduce recurrence



Disease Severity



- Infection can increase the risk of acquiring other STIs such as HIV
- People may be infected for years and transmitting the infection without knowing
- Trichomoniasis may cause serious complications for pregnant mothers and their children including:
 - postabortal infection
 - postcesarean infection
 - low birth weight in infants
 - preterm delivery
